financing or any subsequent refinancing of the Facility, exemptions from sales and use taxes and abatement of real property taxes, consistent with the policies of the Agency, all to be more particularly described in a Final Authorizing Resolution to be adopted by the Agency prior to the closing of the transactions described herein; and

WHEREAS, as of the date of this resolution, no determination for financial assistance has been made; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes and empowers the Agency to promote, develop, encourage and assist projects such as the Facility and to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, prior to the date of the Hearing (defined below), the Agency will have made a determination for financial assistance; and

WHEREAS, prior to the closing of the transaction described herein, a public hearing (the "Hearing") will be held so that all persons with views in favor of or opposed to either the financial assistance contemplated by the Agency or the location or nature of the Facility can be heard; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Hearing will be given prior to the closing of the transaction described herein, and such notice (together with proof of publication) will be substantially in the form annexed hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the minutes of the Hearing are or will be annexed hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has given due consideration to the application of the Company and the Sublessee and to representations by the Company and the Sublessee that the proposed financial assistance is either an inducement to the Company and the Sublessee to maintain the Facility in the Town of Islip or is necessary to maintain the competitive position of the Company and the Sublessee in their respective industries; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York (collectively, the "SEQR Act" or "SEQR"), the Agency constitutes a "State Agency"; and

WHEREAS, to aid the Agency in determining whether the Facility may have a significant effect upon the environment, the Company and Sublessee have prepared and submitted to the Agency an Environmental Assessment Form and related documents (the "Questionnaire") with respect to the Facility, a copy of which is on file at the office of the Agency; and

WHEREAS, the Questionnaire has been reviewed by the Agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town of Islip Industrial Development Agency (a majority of the members thereof affirmatively concurring) that:

- Section 1. Based upon the Environmental Assessment Form completed by the Company and Sublessee and reviewed by the Agency and other representations and information furnished by the Company and the Sublessee regarding the Facility, the Agency determines that the action relating to the acquisition, renovation, equipping, and operation of the Facility is an "unlisted" action, as that term is defined in the SEQR Act. The Agency also determines that the action will not have a "significant effect" on the environment, and, therefore, an environmental impact statement will not be prepared. This determination constitutes a negative declaration for purposes of SEQR. Notice of this determination shall be filed to the extent required by the applicable regulations under SEQR or as may be deemed advisable by the Chairman or Executive Director of the Agency or counsel to the Agency.
- Section 2. The acquisition, renovation and equipping of the Facility by the Agency, the subleasing and leasing of the Company Facility to the Company for the further subleasing to the Sublessee, the leasing of the Equipment to the Sublessee and the provision of financial assistance pursuant to the Act will promote job opportunities, health, general prosperity and the economic welfare of the inhabitants of the Town of Islip and the people of the State of New York and improve their standard of living, and thereby serve the public purposes of the Act, and the same is, therefore, approved.
- Section 3. Subject to the provisions of this resolution, the Agency shall (i) acquire, renovate and equip the Facility, (ii) lease and sublease the Company Facility to the Company and (iii) lease the Equipment to the Sublessee.
- Section 4. The Company and the Sublessee hereby agree to comply with Section 875 of the Act. The Company and the Sublessee further agree that the exemption of sales and use tax provided pursuant to the Act and the appointment of the Company and the Sublessee as agents of the Agency pursuant to this resolution is subject to termination and recapture of benefits pursuant to Section 875 of the Act the recapture provisions of the Lease and Project Agreement, dated a date to be determined (the "Lease Agreement"), by and between the Company and the Agency.
- <u>Section 5</u>. Counsel to the Agency is authorized and directed to work with Transaction Counsel (Nixon Peabody LLP) to prepare, for submission to the Agency, all documents necessary to affect the transfer of the real estate described in the foregoing resolution.
- Section 6. The Chairman, the Executive Director and all members of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed (i) to distribute copies of this resolution to the Company and the Sublessee, and (ii) to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this resolution.
- Section 7. Any expenses incurred by the Agency with respect to the Facility, including the expenses of Transaction Counsel, shall be paid by the Company and the Sublessee. By acceptance hereof, the Company and the Sublessee agree to pay such expenses and further agree to indemnify the Agency, its members, directors, employees and agents and hold the Agency and such persons harmless against claims for losses, damage or injury or any

expenses or damages incurred as a result of action taken by or on behalf of the Agency in good faith with respect to the Facility.

WHEREAS, the Company will sublease an approximately 295,000 square foot portion of the Facility (the "Demised Premises") to 1724 Fifth Avenue Realty LLC (the "Sublessee") pursuant to a Lease Agreement, dated June 20, 2016 (the "Sublease"), by and between the Company and the Sublessee; and

WHEREAS, further, the Sublessee intends to sub-sublease the Demised Premises to Best Yet Market Inc., a New York corporation (the "Tenant"), pursuant to certain lease, dated a date not yet determined (the "Tenant Lease"), by and between the Sublessee and the Tenant, to be used in the Tenant's business as its corporate offices, warehouse distribution for all of its supermarket stores, a food incubator and shared food manufacturing facility, as well as retail supermarket (which retail supermarket will comprise less than 10% of the Demised Premises) and there will be additional production equipment and renovations being acquired, constructed and installed in the Demised Premises (the "Additional Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Tenant presently has approximately 103 full-time and 8 part-time employees and the Tenant expects to increase the number to approximately 163 full-time employees by the end of the second year at the Demised Premises; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the subleasing of the Demised Premises, the Tenant has requested the Agency's consent to sales or use tax exemptions on the purchases or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property in an amount equal to approximately \$650,000 in sales tax benefits totaling approximately \$7,500,000 in purchases in the acquisition, equipping and installation of the Demised Premises (collectively, the "Tenant Sales and Use Tax Benefits"); and

WHEREAS, the Tenant has agreed to indemnify the Agency against certain losses, claims, expenses, damages and liabilities that may arise in connection with the transaction contemplated by the sales and use tax benefits for the Demised Premises and the sub-subleasing of the Demised Premises by the Sublessee to the Tenant.

- (f) It is desirable and in the public interest for the Agency to consent to the subleasing of the Demised Premises to the Tenant; and
- (g) The execution of the Tenant Agency Compliance Agreement will satisfy the requirement of Section 9.3 of the Lease Agreement that any sublease of the Facility be consented to in writing by the Agency; and
- (h) The Tenant Equipment Lease Agreement, dated as of October 1, 2016 or such other date as may be determined by the Agency and counsel to the Agency (the "Equipment Lease Agreement"), between the Agency and the Tenant, will be an effective instrument wherein the Agency leases the Equipment (as defined therein) to the Tenant and appoints the Tenant as its agent in connection with the acquisition, equipping and installation of the Demised premises to the Tenant; and
- (i) The Tenant Equipment Bill of Sale, dated as of October 1, 2016 or such other date as may be determined by the Agency and counsel to the Agency (the "Tenant Equipment Bill of Sale"), from Tenant to the Agency, will be an effective instrument whereby Tenant conveys the Equipment (as defined therein) to the Agency.
- Section 2. The Agency has assessed all material information included in connection with the Tenant's application for financial assistance, including but not limited to, the cost-benefit analysis prepared by the Agency and such information has provided the Agency a reasonable basis for its decision to provide the financial assistance described herein to the Tenant.
- Section 3. The Agency hereby approves the subleasing of Demised Premises by the Sublessee to the Tenant.
- Section 4. The Agency hereby approves the amount of sales and use tax exemptions on the purchases or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property to acquire, install and equip the Demised Premises, for a total aggregate amount of up to \$650,000, with an equivalent aggregate purchasing of approximately \$7,500,000).
- Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution, the Tenant is herewith and hereby appointed the agent of the Agency to acquire, renovate, construct and equip the Demised

Premised. The Tenant is hereby empowered to delegate its status as agent of the Agency to its agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, suppliers, vendors and such other parties as the Tenant may choose in order to acquire, renovate, construct and equip the Demised Premises. The Agency hereby appoints the agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, vendors and suppliers of the Tenant as agent of the Agency solely for purposes of making sales or leases of goods, services and supplies to the Demised Premises, and any such transaction between any agent, subagent, contractor, subcontractor, materialmen, vendor or supplier, and the Tenant, as agent of the Agency, shall be deemed to be on behalf of the Agency and for the benefit of the Demised Premises. This agency appointment expressly excludes the purchase by the Tenant of any motor vehicles, including any cars, trucks, vans or buses which are licensed by the Department of Motor Vehicles for use on public highways or streets. The Tenant shall indemnify the Agency with respect to any transaction of any kind between and among the agents, subagents, contractors, subcontractors, materialmen, vendors and/or suppliers and the Tenant, as agent of the Agency. The aforesaid appointment of the Tenant as agent of the Agency to acquire, renovate, construct and equip the Demised Premises shall expire at the earlier of (a) the completion of such activities and improvements, (b) a date which the Agency designates, or (c) the date on which the Tenant has received exemptions from sales and use taxes in an amount not to exceed \$650,000 in connection with the purchase or lease of equipment, building materials, services or other personal property; provided however, such appointment may be extended at the discretion of the Agency, upon the written request of the Tenant if such activities and improvements are not completed by such time. The aforesaid appointment of the Tenant is subject to the execution of the documents contemplated by this resolution.

Section 6. The Tenant hereby agrees to comply with Section 875 of the Act. The Tenant further agrees that the exemption of sales and use tax provided pursuant to the Act and the appointment of the Tenant as agent of the Agency pursuant to this Authorizing Resolution is subject to termination and recapture of benefits pursuant to Section 875 of the Act.

Section 7. In consequence of the foregoing, the Agency hereby (i) approves the Tenant Sales and Use Tax Benefits, (ii) approves the subleasing of the Demised Premises by the Sublessee to the Tenant, (iii) will execute, deliver and perform the Tenant Equipment Lease Agreement, (iv) will execute, deliver and perform the Tenant Agency Compliance Agreement, and (v) authorizes the execution and delivery of such other related documents as may be necessary or appropriate to effect the provisions of this Resolution.

Section 8.

(a) The Chairman, Executive Director, and all members of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver the Tenant Agency Compliance Agreements in the form(s) the Chairman, Executive Director or any member of the Agency shall approve, and such other related documents respectively, as may be, in the judgment of the Chairman and Counsel to the Agency, necessary or appropriate to effect the transactions contemplated by this resolution including the Tenant Equipment Lease Agreement, the Tenant Agency Compliance Agreement (hereinafter collectively called the "Agency Documents"). The execution thereof by the Chairman, Executive Director or any member of the Agency shall constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

- (b) The Chairman, Executive Director and all members of the Agency are further hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to designate any additional Authorized Representatives of the Agency (as defined in and pursuant to the Lease Agreement).
- Section 9. Counsel to the Agency and Nixon Peabody LLP, Transaction Counsel to the Agency are hereby authorized and directed to prepare, for submission to the Agency, and all documents necessary to effect the consent to the subleasing of the Demised Premises and the Tenant Sales and Use Tax Benefits described in the foregoing resolution.
- Section 7. The Chairman, the Executive Director and any member of the Agency are each hereby authorized and directed (i) to distribute copies of this resolution to the Tenant, and (ii) to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this resolution.
